Full-day tutorial will cover highlights of ISO/IEC 17025 requirements. This course is applicable for organizations that are currently accredited, are in the process of obtaining their ISO/IEC 17025 accreditation or for those who are interested in applying the ISO/IEC 17025 requirements in their facility.

The participant, using ISO/IEC 17025, will be able to:

1. Identify those ISO/IEC 17025 requirements that requires a policy and a procedure
2. Discuss the clauses of ISO/IEC 17025 for real life assessment scenarios
3. Distinguish the requirements for a record from those of a document

This workshop is targeted for anyone who is interested in an overview of the ISO/IEC 17025 standard and how it is applied in an audit setting.
