The abstract is a self-standing document and should not include references, footnotes, figures (or references to them), or tables (or references to them). It should include brief findings, solutions, impacts, and concluding remarks of the work.

The abstract is what readers review first in order to decide whether the paper is relevant to their work and whether the paper warrants further study. Think of an abstract as a condensed summary of your entire paper. The abstract is a succinct, single-paragraph summary of your paper's purpose, main points, method, findings, and conclusions, and is often recommended to be written after the rest of your paper has been completed. The abstract's length should be a minimum of 150 words and a maximum of 350 words; it should be confined within a single paragraph. Thank you and we look forward to your abstract!
